Lectionary Summary:

Fourth Sunday of Easter (Jubilate)

Isaiah 40:25–31 or Lamentations 3:22–33 1 Peter 2:11–20 or 1 John 3:1–3 John 16:16–22

Those Who Wait on the Lord Shall Rejoice

The people of God are pilgrims and sojourners in this world, looking ahead to a destination yet to come (1 Peter 2:11–20). Though we are now children of God, the fullness of what we shall be has not yet been revealed (1 John 3:1-3). We are those who wait on the Lord. "The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him" (Lam. 3:25). Jesus tells us that the wait is just a little while. "A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me" (John 16:16). Though you must experience sorrow for a time, though you must live as strangers in a world that is at enmity with Christ, yet your sorrow will be turned to joy when He returns. "But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength" (Is. 40:31). The little while of weeping shall be replaced with an eternity of rejoicing in the presence of Christ the crucified and risen Savior. "And no one will take your joy from you" (John 16:22).





Thoughts on the Daily Readings:

Old Testament

Leviticus is often viewed as only a book of Law. Even more unfortunate, many Christians think that because the Old Testament Law is no longer binding for those who are free in Christ, they ignore the rich content of the Old Testament. Leviticus, in reality, is full of Gospel, and it has a lot of beautiful things to teach Christians today. The Day of Atonement is one example. The sins of the people are placed on the head of a goat that is then sent out of the camp to die in the wilderness. Christ is our "scapegoat" who bears our sins upon Himself. The other goat involved in the Day of Atonement ritual also prefigures Christ. He is the one who was slain—the One Whose blood was shed and grants us access to the Holy Place in the presence of our Lord.

New Testament

This week, we read about Jesus sending out the Twelve Apostles as well as the seventy-two to prepare His way. It's a fitting time of year to hears these passages as both of our seminaries have recently held their Call Day services and announced where their candidates for ordination will be going upon graduation. The Lord provides for His Church now as He did then. The harvest is certainly plentiful, and yet the laborers have always been few. We pray that the Lord would continue to raise up faithful men to serve His people and for faithful congregations who will support their pastor and respect the authority with which he is sent.

Almighty and gracious God, You have commanded us to pray that You would send forth laborers into Your harvest. Of Your infinite mercy give us true teachers and ministers of Your Word who truly fulfill Your command and preach nothing contrary to Your holy Word. Grant that we, being warned, instructed, nurtured, comforted, and strengthened by Your holy Word, may do those things which are well pleasing to You and profitable for our salvation; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

What is a "catechism"?

A catechism (pronounced KAT-eh-kizm) is a book of instruction usually written in question and answer form. The word "catechism" comes from the Greek word *katekhein*, which means "to instruct." A catechism teaches the basics of the Christian faith.

Why do we need catechisms?

While visiting local churches, Martin Luther found many pastors and their church members were unaware of the true teachings of the Bible. Because of this, the people were living

immoral lives. Martin Luther wrote the catechisms to instruct people in the basics of the Christian faith, that they might know Christ and His forgiveness and live accordingly. We still use Luther's Large and Small Catechisms so that we never forget those things that are necessary for faith in Christ.



Parents: Consider these words from Luther: "I, too, am a theologian who has attained a fairly good practical knowledge and experience of Holy Scriptures through various dangers. But I do not so glory in this gift as not to join my children daily in prayerfully reciting the Catechism. ... For God gave the Word that we should impress it on ourselves. ... Without this practice our souls become rusty, as it were, and we lose ourselves" (Plass, Ewald M., What Luther Says vol. 1 [St. Louis: Concordia, 1986], 125–26).

Stewardship Thoughts:

1 Peter 2:11

"Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul."

Passions of the flesh—that means the things our flesh desires. One way to sum up all the "passions of the flesh" is to call them greed: the desire to have more things to bring us comfort and peace of mind. But that shows us the real problem with greed. It wages war against our soul, and it urges us to place our trust in the things of this world and not in God. But St. Peter reminds us that we are sojourners and exiles. We belong to the kingdom of God. We have been purchased by the blood of Christ and belong to Him. That knowledge frees us from greed, and it frees us for generosity.






