Lectionary Summary:

Sixth Sunday of Easter (Rogate)

Numbers 21:4–9 1 Timothy 2:1–6 or James 1:22–27 John 16:23–33

The Father Answers Our Prayers Because of Jesus

"Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you" (John 16:23). To pray in Jesus' name is to pray as one who has been baptized. For it is in the water that He put His name upon you, claiming you as His own, making you a son of God with access to the Father. By His incarnation and crucifixion, our Lord Jesus broke through the barrier of sin which separated us from God, opening a portal to the Father. To pray in Jesus' name is to pray with faith in Him as the one Mediator between God and men, who gave Himself a ransom for all (1 Tim. 2:1-6). Like Moses in the wilderness, Jesus is our go-between and intercessor before the throne of heaven. He was lifted up for us on the cross that we might be saved and restored to fellowship with the Father (Num. 21:4-9). Looking into this perfect teaching of liberty (James 1:22–27) we pray with boldness and confidence as dear children of God.



Thoughts on the Daily Readings:

Old Testament

The book of Numbers has an unfair reputation as a book of lists and nothing else. In reality, the censuses actually make up a small portion of this book of the Bible. Within these chapters, Israel's time in the wilderness is depicted as one of struggle. Though God provides for them time and time again, Israel rebels against Him over and over. Aaron's sons immediately forego the Lord's instructions for worship and are put to death, Miriam and Aaron question Moses' authority and are punished, and most of the spies express hopelessness in their ability to claim the promised land and doom Israel to wander forty years in the wilderness. The Lord is faithful even when Israel is not (see Romans 3:3), and He reproves him whom He loves (Proverbs 3:12).

New Testament

The story of the "Prodigal Son" is unique to Luke's Gospel account. The general narrative is well known even to many with little to no biblical knowledge. This has led to "prodigal" often being used simply as an allusion to a person who has left the family rather than its actual meaning of a "wastefully extravagant" individual. This simple story is packed full of beneficial teachings. There's a warning against improper use of wealth, an encouragement to value familial relationships, a picture of God's gracious forgiveness, and a cliff-hanger ending that invites contemplation and personal examination. The brother has a choice will he forgive as the father did, or continue to hold it against both his brother and his father and refuse to enter the household for the party? This same question may be posed to us. Will we forgive as the Father forgives, or will we hold a grudge?

What is "prayer"?

Have you ever wanted to talk to God? Well, guess what ... you can! God promises to hear and answer us when we pray. Because we want to concentrate on what we are praying and who we are praying to, we may close our eyes, fold our hands and bow our heads so that we are not distracted by the things around us. You don't have to do all that, though. You can pray anywhere and at anytime.

What should we pray for?

We not only ask God for what we need, but we praise and thank Him for what He has already given us. If you want to, you can pray to God just to talk to him. We pray especially that God would keep us strong in our faith, and that He might bring others to faith too.

Are there different types of prayer?

There are many different types of prayer. Much of our worship is prayers, including the Confession, the Agnus Dei, and the Post-Communion Canticle. You can find prayers for different times and needs on pages 305–18 in *Lutheran Service Book*.



Parents: Direct your child to the different prayers in our worship. (For example The Prayer of the Church) Turn to pages 327 in *Lutheran Service Book*. Read through Luther's Morning and Evening Prayers. Try using them at home with your children when they wake up in the morning and before they go to bed at night.


